book review Democracy in Chains: The Deep History of the Radical Right's Stealth Plan for America

I found it hard to read this book without becoming angry. But thanks to the extensive research by MacLean, I've finally begun to understand why some things in America are the way they are. One example: the large tuition increases at public universities over the last thirty years can be attributed to deliberate plans to transform the universities to be run more like corporate-style entities requiring students to pay the full costs of their education. The strategies behind all this were developed by a libertarian economics professor, James Buchanan, beginning in the 1960s. Eventually, he was discovered by the billionaire, Charles Koch, and the movement enjoyed practically unlimited

funding from then on.

Among their goals were the destruction of labor unions, the revision of tax codes, the undoing of environmental protections, the elimination of regulations in general, the privatization of Medicare and Social Security, and the privatization of virtually everything from schools to prisons and parks. Their movement included an attempt to transform the legal profession by revising the curricula at many law schools. As Koch put it, the goal was to save capitalism from democracy. They also established a new conservative think tank called the CATO institute.

Buchanan's concept of freedom was freedom from big government, freedom to consume, produce, save and invest. His followers believed that the only legitimate role of government was to insure law and order and provide for national defense. Ideally, there would be no other services. By the 1990s, the Koch team had pretty well taken control of the Republican party. Any remaining moderate Republicans faced big money thrown at their opponents at the next primary election.

The US has now reached its greatest disparity in the distribution of wealth. To value liberty for the wealthy minority above all else and enshrine it in the nation's governing rules will ultimately lead to oligarchy. Koch views society as split between makers and takers, and he wants to be protected from the takers. He understands that the majority of Americans expect their government to offer

many human services as well as environmental and safety regulations. So the Republican strategy in elections is to rely increasingly on various means of voter suppression.

MacLean points out that our constitutional system has promoted stability but has made it difficult to achieve major changes. Many issues that have been supported by a majority of the people have failed to make it through Congress. The House of Representatives truly represents the people, but the Senate has a very unfair constituency. Fifty senators represent just fifty million people from the smallest twenty-five states, while the other fifty senators represent 257 million people from the twenty-five largest states.


Note and vote
