"I want people to feel safe," Mayor Bruce Harrell told members and friends of the Metropolitan Democratic Club of Seattle at its December 12 Winter Holiday Party, as he explained why he is not in favor of defunding the police. Mr Harrell, who was endorsed by the MDC, was the special guest at this year's annual event, held by Zoom.

He thanked the MDC for its support, adding that "the endorsement was so powerful for me" largely because he shares the values of the organization, which, he noted earlier, is "Seattle's only citywide organization of Democratic leaders and activists."

"No one," he asserted, "can question the MDC's commitment to the city."

Noting the presence of former Seattle City Councilmember and Seattle Port Commissioner Peter Steinbrueck, Mr Harrell stated that "the port's loss is the city's gain" and said he would be talking to Mr Steinbrueck soon about how he can participate in the new administration.

Mr Steinbrueck, a long-time member of the MDC, commented that he had not seen coalition building in any of the last three city administrations, that the MDC should support Mr Harrell as someone who is a coalition builder and can "balance the city council." We "have to look for every opportunity to unify the city," he added.

Mr Harrell indicated that in January he will have a clearer idea of what the MDC can do to help him achieve his agenda once he has assembled his team and put structure around various issues.

"There will be all kinds of things you can help me with," he said.

King County Assessor John Wilson, who also attended the event, shared his vision for the future with the organization.

A message from the director

As most of you know, in an effort to keep the MDC alive and vital, the members of the MDC have been discussing changes to its governing structure and to the responsibilities of its officers. To that end, we voted at our December meeting to create the paid position of executive director to assume many of the duties of the officers. The members also voted to hire me for the position at \$500/month effective January 1, 2022. A copy of a memorandum of understanding has been signed by me and President Jack Whisner.

Several issues/tasks must be addressed as we look forward to another year. We should reasonably expect some of these to take two or three months to accomplish or in some cases, even longer. Jack Whisner will continue as president until we reorganize.

Recruitment of officers

Allan Munro volunteered to head a committee to recruit officers. At present it seems we need a president and a treasurer; a vice president would be desirable but optional. Secretarial functions are included among the executive director's responsibilities. Allan will be calling a meeting of those who would like to serve on this committee. The committee will establish criteria for selecting candidates for the offices of president and treasurer, develop lists of their qualifications and responsibilities (which will be minimal), interview potential candidates and establish a slate of candidates.

"We need to do more than return to normalcy," he said, "we need a new more sustainable economy and we need to help those in the shadows to find a better life. Seattle and King County should be a model and a stellar example of Biden's Build Back Better."



obituaries

George Wallerstein

1930 - 2021



George Wallerstein, who first joined the Metropolitan Democratic Club of Seattle in 1966, died May 18, 2021. He was emeritus professor and founding chair of the Department of Astronomy at the University of Washington.


Mr Wallerstein earned his PhD in 1958 at the California Institute of Technology and went on to teach at University of California Berkeley. In 1965 he was invited to chair the Astronomy Department at the University of Washington, a position he occupied until 1980. In 2000 he was awarded the American Astronomical Society's Henry Norris Russell Prize for a lifetime of distinguished research.

For those who wish to remember George, the family suggests a contribution to the George Wallerstein Graduate Student Fund in the Astronomy Department at the UW.

A memorial service will take place at a later date.

George Fleming

1938 - 2021



George Fleming, a former member of the Metropolitan Democratic Club of Seattle, died December 6, 2021. He was elected to the Washington House of Representatives in 1968 and to the Senate two years later, becoming its second African American member. He represented the 37th legislative district for 22 years.

Seattle Mayor Bruce Harrell, also a former member of the MDC, called Mr Fleming "a trailblazer and warrior" and said "he forged a trail of success that I followed. He never hesitated to help me, advise me, and inspire me."

Jolene Unsoeld

1931 - 2021



Jolene Unsoeld, a former member of the Metropolitan Democratic Club of Seattle, died November 28, 2021. She served as US Representative, 1989 – 1995, representing the 3rd congressional district, and as a state legislator from 1985 – 1989, representing the 22nd legislative district.

Ms Unsoeld was the first woman to climb the north face of the Grand Teton. Her husband, Willi, and her daughter, Devi, both died in climbing accidents.

She is remembered for her work that led to the creation of the Washington Public Disclosure commission and her opposition to gun control and the North American Free Trade Agreement.

Details about a memorial service have not been announced.
