# <sup>op-ed</sup> Polls/predictions – beware

As this is written, June 26, 2020, things look very good for the Democrats' presidential candidate. "Biden Gains Lead in Key State as Trump Loses White Voters" reads a New York Times front-page headline. Overall, Joseph Biden has a 14.2 point lead. Prediction: Biden will win, probably in a landslide.

Not necessarily so.

In 1988 Michael Dukakis had a 14 point lead following the Republican National Convention in August. George H W Bush was saddled with the scandals of the Reagan Administration, particularly Iran Contra. Bush had said he was "out of the loop" on Iran Contra. Nobody really believed him. (I still don't.)

Eleven weeks later Bush won the election with a decisive victory.

What had happened?
