January 22 – Zoom meeting The Big Scary "S" Word

Judi Gibbs has arranged for us to see the film "The Big Scary "S" Word." The film is described as an exploration of where American socialism has been, why it was suppressed, and what a renewed American socialism might look like. It delves into the history of the movement and the people striving to build a socialist future today and includes interviews with Bernie Sanders, Alexandra Ocasio-Cortez, Cornel West, and others.

February 8 – in-person meeting Alternatives 6 and L

Seattle City Councilmember Alex Pedersen, a member of the city council's land use committee, will talk to us about comprehensive planning and Alternatives 6 and L. Throughout his career in both public service and the private sector, he has worked on community development, affordable housing, and fiscal accountability issues. Jonis Davis, a member of the Metropolitan Democratic Club of Seattle, died November 9, 2022. She and her husband, Charles Davis, joined the MDC in 2009. Mr Davis has provided the following information:

Ms Davis was born in Providence RI, where she attended public schools and Brown University from which she graduated Magna Cum Laude in American Civilization. She started studying French literature at the University of Wisconsin, but left after one semester to return to Rhode Island to marry Mr Davis, who was stationed there in the Navy.

She taught English as a second language at Seattle Community College and at Portland State College. She also taught at Bush School and worked at American Friends Service Committee, first as a program manager and then as a fundraiser, a position she kept for about 30 years.

Ms Davis was active in two book clubs and various community and political activities. An activist, she and Mr Davis were members of the Washington Democratic Council and later became members of the 37th District Democrats. They were both active in issues relating to Middle East peace. She was a founder of the Seattle Committee for Israeli-Palestinian Peace.

A shiva was held for Ms Davis November 13 at the Davis home.

January 11

Access to meeting room The MDC resumed meeting at Gethsemane Lutheran Church for its first meeting of the year. February 22 – Zoom meeting Protecting Taiwan

Dr David Bachman, Henry M
Jackson professor of international
studies at the University of
Washington Jackson School of International Studies, will talk about how
the US can help protect the independence of Taiwan and avoid a combat
confrontation with China. Dr Bachman has published widely on Chinese
domestic and foreign policy, including two books, entitled Bureaucracy,
Economy, and Leadership in China —
The Institutional Origins of the Great
Leap Forward and Chen Yun and the
Chinese Political System.

March 22 – Zoom meeting Haaland v. Brackeen, Indian Child Welfare Act

Haaland v. Brackeen is the lawsuit brought by Texas and others, who allege that the Indian Child Welfare Act is unconstitutional because it violates equal protection. Oral arguments were heard by the US Supreme Court in November 2022. A decision is expected in the first half 2023. Our speakers are from the Native American Relief Fund. which has filed many amicus briefs on behalf of the defendants of the ICWA. Erin Dougherty Lynch is the managing attorney of NARF's Anchorage AK office and leads the organization's Indian child welfare work. She is counsel of record on

the tribal amicus brief representing numerous recognized tribes and Indian organizations. Attorney Beth Margaret Wright, who works in the Boulder CO office of NARF, also focuses on Indian child welfare issues including Indian boarding school healing.

April 12 – in person Evaluating electoral districts

Dr Courtney Thatcher, associate professor of mathematics and computer science and the University of Puget Sound, will explain the results of a four -year interdisciplinary research program in which students from across the country built spatial models to evaluate electoral district maps. The study was conducted under a grant from the National Science Foundation Research Experiences for Undergraduates. Dr Thatcher is hopeful that this research may help reduce gerrymandering and produce fairer election districts.

MDC resumes inperson meetings
